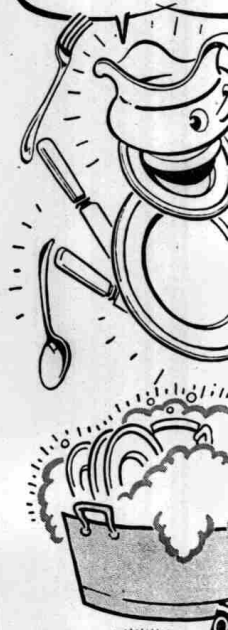
Film Displays
