Benefits to Beat the Cold

With more **cold and frosty weather** forecast - and maybe more snow, - we thought it would be useful to put together a newsletter looking at how the benefits you get could help you **heat your home**.

Some of these are **paid automatically** if you meet the qualifying conditions.


Others have to be claimed by you.

WINTER FUEL PAYMENT.

If you we born before 5th October 1954, you could qualify for a winter fuel payment.

You might not qualify if you have been in hospital or a care home or if you are subject to immigration control or not ordinarily resident in the UK. Ask for more advice.



The Winter Fuel Payment is:

- £200 if you are under 80 and are the only person in your home who qualifies.
- * £100 if you are under 80 and someone else in your household under 80 also qualifies.
- * **£300** if you are **over 80**, and the only person in your household who qualifies.
- * £150 if you are over 80 and someone else in your household aged over 80 also qualifies.
- * £200 if you are aged over 80 and there is someone else aged under 80 in your household (they will get £100).
- * If you get **Pension Credit**, you get the **full amount**, even if another pensioner who is not your partner shares your home.

COLD WEATHER PAYMENTS.

Worth £25 per week, these should happen automatically if the average temperature at your local weather station is zero or below for seven days in a row. You qualify if:

- You are not working and get Universal Credit, and you have either i) a child under 5 or ii) you have limited capability for work or work-related activity. You also qualify if you get a disabled child addition in your UC, whether you are working or not.
- You get Income Support, Income-based JSA or Income-related ESA and you either i) responsible for a child under 5, or ii) get Child Tax Credit including a disabled child element, or iii) a disability or pensioner premium, or iv) you have limited capability for work/work-related activity.
- * You get Pension Credit.

THE WARM HOME DISCOUNT SCHEME.

You could get £140 off your electricity bill for winter 2020/2021 if:

- * You get Guarantee Pension Credit or you have a low income, and;
- * You (or your partner) is the bill payer and your energy supplier is part of the scheme.

If you get Guarantee Pension Credit you should already have received a letter telling you to call a helpline by 26 February 2021 to confirm your details. If you get Guarantee Pension Credit and have not yet heard, please call the helpline on 0800 731 0214.



If you have a **low income** but don't get Guarantee Pension Credit, the rules are different. Your **electricity supplier** decides who can get the discount.

Check with your supplier to see if you're eligible and how to apply. Do this as soon as possible - the number of discounts suppliers can give are limited.
